What is my school doing?

If your school is listed this school year as **Phase 1: Getting Glasses**, that means that the Health Department came to do vision screening for all the students. After the screening, students who needed a follow-up got a paper consent form to take home. If parents signed the form, their child has already seen—or will soon see—an eye doctor for a full exam at not out of pocket cost. If they need glasses, they'll get them for free!

When your school is listed as **Phase 2: Monitoring and Replacements** means that the students who got glasses are being checked to make sure they're using them and taking care of them. Please help students understand how important their glasses are and their value. They only can receive one replacement if they are lost or broken. Schools under **Phase 3: Community Education** can participate in educating the students and the community about the importance of eye health and care. These schools are also getting ready to receive the Vision for Baltimore Program next school year, which will bring eye exams and glasses to students who need them.
